In order for a prospective student to be considered for admission into a competitive admission program, all of the following must apply:

- Applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older at time of application.
- Applicant has submitted an electronic Letter of Interest to the Director for Admissions. The required form is available online at

- Applicant has a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher.
- Attend a Competitive Admission Workshop during RADT 1010.
- Applicant has completed all required courses with a “C” or better.
- Completion of the ATI TEAS Allied Health Exam with the following requirements:
 - Applicants must have taken the TEAS Allied Health Exam on the OTC campus.
 - Applicants must achieve a composite score of 60% or higher for program eligibility.
 - Applicants will have three attempts for the exam within a calendar year (January-December). Attempts can be scheduled at least 30 days apart.
 - The ATI TEAS composite score will be used to determine the 60% of the overall combined score and added to the 40% GPA to generate the student’s competitive score and ranking.

For competitive admission purposes only, the cumulative GPA includes all attempts at required coursework listed below within the previous five years. A student may submit a waiver through the Admissions Office to have all coursework older than five (5) years to be included in the calculations for competitive admissions. A student will not be able to choose specific coursework to include and exclude if a waiver is submitted. Coursework may be obtained by enrolling in the Interdisciplinary Degree for the Radiologic Technology Degree programs.

Required coursework for Radiologic Technology:

ENGL 1101, PSYC 1101, Humanities/Fine Arts elective and General Education electives, MATH 1111 (or MATH 1101 or MATH 1103), ALHS 1090, RADT 1010, BIOL 2113, BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114, BIOL 2114L.

RADT 1010 will not be waived if this course is five years old or older. Students must retake RADT 1010 if more than 5 years old.

NOTE: Grades from transfer credits will be included in the calculation of the cumulative GPA for competitive admissions. A student will not be able to choose specific coursework to include and exclude if credits are transferred from a previous college.

All admissions requirements must be met by the end of the summer semester prior to spring entrance for Radiologic Technology. Students must sit out fall semester prior to a spring entrance. A mandatory program orientation is held after students have been accepted into the program in early August. Students unable to attend this mandatory orientation will have to forfeit their seat in the program.

ATI TEAS Testing Process

The Test of Essential Academic Skills (ATI TEAS) is a multiple-choice assessment that measures basic academic preparedness in Reading, Math, Science, English, and Language Usage.

Applicants for Diagnostic Medical Sonography (DMS), Echocardiography, and Radiologic Technology are required to take the ATI TEAS Allied Health Exam before the scheduled due date for program eligibility. DMS and Echo end of spring semester prior to fall program eligibility. Radiologic Technology end of summer semester prior to spring program eligibility.

Applicants will have the opportunity to sit for the ATI TEAS three times in a calendar year (January – December) with 30-days between each attempt. The applicants' first attempt is \$40. A \$65 re-testing fee is required for each subsequent attempt.

Applicants must have a composite score of 60% or higher in order to be considered for program eligibility. The highest composite score for each attempt will be used for competitive admission.

The ATI TEAS exam must be completed on the Ogeechee Technical College campus. Scores from other testing centers will not be accepted.
